He will be organizing and looking for sponsorship for wheelchairs for the Global Wheelchair Mission. The goal this year is to procure 20 wheelchairs each costing \$150.00 a piece. Most of the wheelchairs will go to Knights Community Hospital Equipment Lend Program (KC HELP) on the Kitsap peninsula. A few will be remain in Oak Harbor. Great News!

Thank you, Brothers, especially Rusty Waters (Newsletter Editor), Jim Spoltman (Webmaster), Rich Mueller (Grand Knight), Ralph Byars (District Deputy), and Fr. Paul Nkolombidzo (from Malawi) for the beginnings of this story.

The council's Chalice story began in August during the council's summer family picnic and posted in the September, October, and November Newsletters, has taken on a wider audience. The Chalice Story, which includes other assemblies' chalice efforts, has been brought into the limelight.

The online *Northwest Catholic* magazine has posted an article on the 4th Degree Chalice Program. It features assemblies in Western Washington, including the Whidbey-Fidalgo Assembly 2276, along with Council 3361... in which the council's story originally began. It is amazing how this story transpired and has become part of the 4th Degree Chalice Program article.

Thank you to all who helped! It will have a tremendous impact on newly ordained Malawian Priests.

To date, there has been 13 individuals who have donated a Chalice Set with Carry Case to this worthy cause in providing new liturgical vessels to newly ordained Priests.

15. Report of the Third Degree

Fr. John E. O'Brien Grand Knight, Rich Mueller, summarized the Chalice Story that began in August at the council's summer family picnic. The Chalice Story gained noticeable momentum when a Northwest Magazine editor, who conducted research on the surrounding 4th Degree Assemblies and their 4th Chalice Programs. During her research, she came upon Fr. John E. O'Brien's website where she viewed newsletter articles on the council's Chalice Story and their efforts to provide liturgical vessels for the newly ordained priests in Malawi, Africa.

This effort gained movement when the FN purchased 10 Chalice Sets with carrying cases and made them available in the hopes others would have a desire to purchase and donate a Chalice Set to next year's priest ordination in Malawi. Each set with carrying case cost \$200.00 each, which includes etching. Each chalice will be etched with the 4th Degree emblem and a memorial for someone special.

The five Chalice Sets are destined for the priest ordination next July and to provide the other five for future ordinations.

The Fr. John E. O'Brien GK made a motion to have the assembly repay the FN on the amount that remains to be collected. The Motion was Seconded and was Tabled till next meeting in January when the FN will provide financial data on the remaining amount.
